




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Education Support Series Part III

Attorney Franklin J. Hickman has focused his career on legal issues affecting persons with mental disabilities since his graduation from the University of Pennsylvania School of Law in 1973, where he received the Wiley C. Rutledge Memorial Award.

Frank has represented families in special education cases since 1975 in negotiations, mediations, due process proceedings and cases in all courts, including the U.S. Court of Appeals for the Sixth Circuit. He spends a major part of his practice on cases under the Individuals with Disabilities Education Act (IDEA), which defines and protects rights of children who need special education.

Adoption Network Cleveland is honored to host Frank who was named Best Lawyers® Lawyer of the Year for Education Law in the Cleveland area (2018 and 2023), is a recipient of the Lifetime Achievement Award from the Ohio Association of County DD Boards (2018), and was inducted into the Cuyahoga County Board of DD Hall of Fame (2012).
