Are you a student who is interested in learning more about lifelong adoption issues?



The Donaldson Adoption Institute in New York City reports that “about 60 percent of Americans have a personal connection to adoption.” Adoption is a lifelong journey and not a onetime legal event. There are ongoing issues that those outside the adoption community may not realize.

Whether touched by adoption directly or pursuing a career in a helping profession, there is likely to be a time in your life when being educated about adoption from many perspectives will be useful.

Adoption Network Cleveland, a non-profit organization that offers support, education and advocacy, offers a Scholars Program that is open to all college students. All participants who fulfill the requirements will receive an official Adoption Network Cleveland Scholars Program Certificate at the end of the program.

This is a once-in-a-lifetime experience where you will be able to expand your personal and professional skill set by learning more about the journey of adoption. From a variety of perspectives, which includes birthparents, adult adoptees, adoptive parents as well as prospective adoptive parents, you will learn the meaning of adoption through personal stories, workshops and meetings. In the end you will get a comprehensive understanding of the mission and services provided by Adoption Network Cleveland, a full understanding of the importance of a supportive adoption community, and a certificate will be awarded to you when the program is completed.

Program Requirements:

- Be a registered student at an accredited college or university.
- Become a member of Adoption Network Cleveland at the student rate which includes program fee.
- Attend a minimum of two General Support and Discussion Meetings.
- Attend Adoption Network Cleveland's Annual Meeting held in November.
